KARNATAKA ISSUES

- The Church Street pedestrianisation project has received the Union government's recognition with the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) giving a running trophy to the state government apart from other awards. The project in which the Directorate of Urban Land Transport, Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Energy Systems Catapult, Urban Morph others collaborated, was successful in proving the benefits of pedestrian-first approach in selected urban streets.
- A recent Study has said **Climate change to impact vegetation in 7 Karnataka districts**. It is conducted by The Karnataka state action plan on climate change which has noticed 38 per cent of forest area in the state would be hit by climate change by the 2030s. Districts affected include Bijapur, Raichur, Koppal, Bellary, Chitradurga, Kodagu and Hassan
- A project called 'Waste solutions for a circular economy in India', funded by the EU and the German Federal Ministry of the Environment and Nature Conservation and Nuclear Safety (BMU), will provide the BBMP technical and financial support in setting up compost facilities and bio-methanation plants.
- Political party Janata Dal is all set to start 'Janata Jaladhare' soon, which is expected to raise awareness among people about the rivers in the state and the water utility.
- Union Ministry of Tribal Affairs has provided an opportunity to open Vana Dhana Vikas Kendra to provide a market to the minor forest products collected by tribals in Madikeri district. Van Dhan Vikas Kendras constituted under VAN DHAN scheme, provide skill up-

gradation and capacity building training and setting up of primary processing and value addition facilities

- From this year, the Karnataka government has decided to celebrate 'Onake Obavva Jayanti' on November 11 throughout the state. She is a brave woman warrior of Chitradurga who Died fighting the troops of Hyder Ali
- Death Anniversary of Kuvempu recently celebrated. He was greatest Kannada Poet, Novelist, Author, Thinker and Critic of 20th century
- The Forest Department staff have named a twoyear-old elephant calf at Sakrebail elephant camp near Shivamogga after actor Puneeth Rajkumar, who passed away recently.





- Bengaluru Solid Waste Management Limited (BSWML) has been set up as a government-owned company to execute solid waste management (SWM) projects on behalf of BBMP based on an executive order and without any statutory basis which is essential.
- Chief Minister of Karnataka announced two committees for the revival of road transport corporations (RTC) and power utilities (Escoms). Retired IAS officer M R Srinivas Murthy will head a committee that will look at financial and improvements for RTCs. Similarly, retired IAS officer K Jayaraj will lead the effort for Escoms to make them self-reliant in terms of revenues
- The BMTC has become the country's first state transport utility to have inducted BS VI buses (procured from Ashok Leyland). They are Automotive emission norms based on the European regulations (Euro norms) introduced in 2000. The major difference in standards between the existing BS-IV and the new BS-VI auto fuel norms is the presence of sulphur.
- A farmer from Mandya has bagged the Plant Genome Saviour Award in recognition of his
 efforts to conserve the indigenous variety of paddy and agrarian heritage. It is conferred
 by ICAR
- A jackfruit tree at Janagere village in Magadi taluk is believed to be State's oldest tree of this variety and one of the oldest in the country is now in the limelight as agricultural and horticultural scientists are striving to get "heritage tree" status for it. The tree has a massive canopy. With a height of 19.5 m and a trunk girth of 6.5 m, it is visible from a long distance to visitors who come to this village during summer to taste its fruits.
- Puneeth Rajkumar to get Karnataka Ratna award posthumously For his contributions to cinema and social service
- Karnataka promulgated an Ordinance for the amendment of the Karnataka Municipal Corporations Act, 1976, and the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) Act, 2020.
 This amendment will allow the civic body to collect ground rent, licence fee, building plan approval fee, scrutiny fee, and security deposit.
- Australian Prime Minister Scott Morrison on Wednesday said an Australian consulate
 would be set up in Bengaluru and also announced the establishment of Australia-India
 Centre of Excellence for Critical and Emerging Technology Policy, while addressing the
 inaugural session of the Bengaluru Tech Summit.

- Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP) is an eye disease that could causes blindness in premature babies. KIDROP is the flagship tele-ROP programme started by Narayana Nethralaya in association with the Karnataka Government in 2009. It is a tele-medicine platform that helps pre-term babies born in neo-natal intensive care units (NICUs) who do not have an ROP specialist to screen and treat babies on time.
- A student outreach programme called "Education on Wheels", that will provide an immersive learning experience to students of community schools in rural areas was launched by Reva University
- Sixteen girl students from Belagavi district, who have excelled in Kannada in school, have been awarded a one-time scholarship by 'Keli Katheya', a Kannada audiobook initiative. Keli Katheya was started in 2014 to bring alive some Kannada short stories in an audio format though film artistes' voices. Profits generated from the sale of the audio book go towards supporting the education of girls in the border areas of Karnataka.
- **Bengaluru** has reported fewer cases of **Vector Borne diseases** like dengue and chikungunya this year compared to last year. Vector-borne diseases are Human illnesses caused by parasites, viruses and bacteria that are transmitted by vectors.
- Karnataka legislature to seek financial autonomy in lines of Lok sabha. Himachal is the first state to achieve so
- Kanakadasa Jayanti celebrated in Karnataka
- Lalitha Mahal Palace, a celebrated architectural icon built by the Mysore royals has turned 100. It was built by Krishna-raja Wadiyar IV for stay of viceroys and other state guests. Architect of the palace was E W Fritchley
- ENVIS Centre & Energy and Wetlands Research Group of the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) prepared a proposal for the declaration of Aghanashini estuary as a Ramsar wetland site of international importance.
- To foster technology-led innovation and seamless passenger experiences, **Bangalore**International Airport Limited (BIAL) has partnered with Microsoft India for the 'BIAL
 Genie Hackathon' to develop an app using Microsoft Azure.
- Researchers at the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) in Bengaluru, along with collaborators, have identified potential **blood-based biomarkers** to predict disease progression and survival times in those with late-stage brain tumours.
- The Karnataka government is likely to hand over the **Sainik school** being developed in the name of freedom fighter Sangolli Rayanna at his birthplace in Belgavi district, to the **Defence Ministry**. Sainik schools are jointly run by state governments and ministry of defence.




- Bangalore International Airport Ltd (BIAL) said KIA is the first airport in
 South Asia to commission the Rosenbauer Firefighting Simulator. The
 simulator has numerous scenarios to help firefighters prepare for real-life
 emergencies. Personnel can train in the tactical use of Rosenbauer Panther trucks as well
 as operate High Reach Extendable Turrets for extreme aircraft fire emergencies.
- A venom research centre will be established in Bengaluru on the premises of the Institute of Bioinformatics and Applied Biotechnology (IBAB) in Helix Biotech Park.
- The Karnataka Agricultural Price Commission (KAPC) has recommended to the State
 Government to seek permission from the Centre for increasing the procurement of
 quantity of foodgrains under the MSP for distribution at subsidised prices under the public
 distribution system (PDS). PDS is a System of management for food and distribution of
 food grains run by central and state governments.
- Karnataka must procure locally-grown produce for distribution under the Public Distribution System (PDS), the Karnataka Agriculture Price Commission (KAPC) recommended to the state government in a report
- Taking note of the rise in the number of children who are malnourished and anaemic in north Karnataka, the Department of Public Instruction has decided to provide eggs to students in government and aided schools in seven districts from December under Mid-Day meal scheme, which is under Ministry of education. The scheme Guarantees one meal to all children in government and aided schools and madarsas supported under Samagra Shiksha.



- Karnataka's 'Chota Mumbai' Hubballi has emerged as a key hub for all kinds of valves and related accessories and started contributing significantly to domestic and exports markets. Major global players have shifted their focus to India, says trade body; Hubballi sells, exports valves worth ₹1,000 cr. per annum
- **Nestlings**, a cloud-based **AI platform** based in the Silicon Valley in California, on Thursday opened its first office outside of the US in Bengaluru.



These labs will conduct battery research and work on charging infrastructure and automotive health monitoring.
- Indian boxer **Akash Kumar** became the 7th Indian male boxer who won a medal at the **World Boxing Championships** held in Belgrade, Serbia
- The Election Commission has noted that the 22 Biju Janata Dal MLAs who were appointed

 do not attract disqualification for holding an office of profit. If an MLA or an MP holds a
 government office and receives benefits from it, then that office is termed as an "office

- The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) has

- Indian navy participates in India, Singapore and Thailand trilateral maritime exercise

- The 16th Annual Status of Education Report (ASER) 2021 (Rural) was released by Pratham foundation.
- West Bengal launched an ambitious "Duare Ration" scheme for providing foodgrains under the public distribution system at the doorstep for the entire population.
- Prime Minister inaugurated the 341 km long six-lane Purvanchal Expressway. The
 Purvanchal Expressway connects Lucknow-Sultanpur road (NH-731) and National
 Highway No. 31, 18 km east of UP-Bihar border and can be expanded to eight-lane in the
 future.
- National Mineral Development Corporation (NMDC), a public enterprise under Ministry
 of Steel celebrated its 64th Formation Day. It is India's largest exporter & producer of iron
 ore, located in Hyderabad established in 1958. It maintains the nation's sole diamond
 mine at Patna in MP
- The 'India@75 BRO Motorcycle Expedition' has successfully completed the third leg covering 2,450 kilometres in less than 11 days and reached Doom Dooma, Assam on November 14, 2021 after being flagged off from Siliguri on November 05, 2021.
- Country's first-of-its kind, dedicated business incubator to be known as LINAC- NCDC
 Fisheries Business Incubation Centre (LIFIC) was inaugrated in Haryana's
 Gurugram.National Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC), an implementing
 agency for the LIFIC
- 380 endangered Indian star tortoises seized in Karnataka. They are protected under Schedule IV of Wild Life Protection Act, 1972



- The **52nd International Film Festival of India (IFFI)** is paying a special tribute to **Sir Sean Connery, the first actor to portray the most famous fictional British spy, James Bond** on the big screen.
- India has slipped to **82nd position in 2021**, five places down from 77th rank last year, in a global list that measures **business bribery risks**. The list by TRACE, an anti-bribery standard setting organisation, measures business bribery risk in 194 countries, territories, and autonomous and semi-autonomous regions.
- State of the art, prototype Air Pollution Control Tower (APCT) developed inhouse by BHEL in Noida was recently inaugurated. Designed and developed by BHEL's Corporate R&D Division, manufactured at its HEEP Haridwar plant, and installed by Power Sector [NR] Noida, the APCT operates by pulling polluted air through its base and capturing the particulate matter in filters installed in the tower. Clean air is then released from the top of the tower. The captured particulate matter gets collected in the hopper at the bottom of the APCT for periodic removal for disposal.
- The Vice President, addressing scientists and staff of the U R Rao Satellite Centre suggested to ISRO to give a thrust to the indigenously-developed regional navigation satellite system, NaVIC for global use.
- The Ganga Connect Exhibition was inaugurated in Birmingham on 15th November, 2021 at the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire after successful inaugurations at Glasgow and Cardiff, UK.
- Union Minister of State for Culture inaugurated the three-day festival "Kashi Utsav" in Varanasi. It aims to celebrate iconic luminaries of Kashi. A theme has been dedicated to each day of the festival and these are: 'Kashi ke Hastakshar'; 'Kabir, Raidas ki Bani aur Nirgun Kashi' and 'Kavita aur Kahani Kashi ki Zubani'.


