
KARNATAKA ISSUES

- Karnataka agriculture department has proposed about 26 potential areas for investors
 and come out with fresh guidelines to regulate tourist activities on farms as interest
 surges. Agritourism or agrotourism involves any agriculturally based operation or activity
 that brings visitors to a farm
- To ensure that quality healthcare is accessible to all citizens, the existing Primary Health Centres (PHCs) and referral hospitals under BBMP will be converted to 'Smart Clinics'. They will be executed by the Bengaluru Smart City Ltd. (BSCL)
- The first consignment of **Kashmiri walnuts** was recently flagged off from Budgam. A truck carrying 2,000 kgs was **despatched to Bengaluru**, **Karnataka** under **the One District**, **One Product (ODOP)** Initiative of the Ministry of Commerce & Industry.
- Two **new smog towers** have been recently inaugurated in Delhi. **Bengaluru and Chandigarh** also installed smog towers this year.
- Karnataka legislators to get Constitution Club for at Balabrooie guest house
- Covid warriors to receive Namma Bengaluru Awards
- A book on life of **Shivaram Karanth** called **"GROWING OF KARANTH"** was recently released. Kota Shivarama Karanth was an Indian polymath, who was a novelist in Kannada language, playwright and an ecological conservationist.
- As senior citizens continue to face a plethora of problems induced by the pandemic, NGOs have urged the State Government to step in. Among their demands are reinstating the State Council for Senior Citizens and addressing insurance coverage for elders. State Council was headed by the Minister for Women and Child Development, Director Department of Differently Abled and Senior Citizens Empowerment and also involved representatives from NGOs and senior citizens. It was formed in 2007, but the implementation has not been there
- Justice Ritu Raj Awasthi, a senior judge of the Allahabad High Court's Lucknow Bench, will now be the Chief Justice of the Karnataka High Court. As per article 217, the Chief Justice of the high court is appointed by the President in consultation with the Chief justice of India as well as the Governor of the state in question.





- To equip students pursuing higher education courses in Karnataka with industry-aligned skills, the **state government** announced its **official collaboration** with the **National Association of Software and Service Companies (NASSCOM).** This partnership is expected to benefit more than 5 lakh students (studying in government and private institutions) every year. NASSCOM is non-profit global trade association of Indian Information Technology (IT) and Business Process Outsourcing (BPO) industry
- India Meteorological Department (IMD) has put the city on yellow alert with the forecast indicating that Bengaluru and several other parts of the state are likely to witness heavy rains
- Mahiti Kanaja, a web portal providing Karnataka government information, now has 160 services and 50 departments in its fold.
- Experts feel that peak load management of power in summer months may be affected if the Karnataka State continues to draw hydel power in excess for some more time.
- Karnataka State Disaster Management Authority (KSDMA) has attributed the repeated tremors experienced in Vijayapura Kalaburagi districts between September 4 and October 11 to a phenomenon called hydro-In hydro-seismicity, water from heavy rainfall enters small fractures in rocks and causes pressure within them. It is described as one of the major reasons for earthquake swarms in peninsular India



- According to data from KSNDMC, between October 1 and 13, as many as 16 districts had rainfall in 'large excess', which means 60% and above rainfall.
- Over one lakh pages of manuscripts at **Moorusavir Mutt at Hubballi** have been scanned and stored in digital format.
- Pepper growers of Mangaluru are worried as the crops are being affected by 'Soragu
 Raga' (bacterial wilt) following incessant rainfall in the region. The wilting disease
 Manifested by wilting the leaves and stems of affected plants. It causes the sudden stop
 of sap circulation in the vessels of diseased plants because of several possible species of
 pathogenic bacteria can lead to the rapid death of plants.
- An unprecedented spike in container costs by seven times, from around ₹1.5 lakh to ₹11 lakh, is threatening to put a spanner in the works just as global trade is gathering steam.



The government has to act immediately before this spike in tariff begins to hurt the economy, according to Karnataka Small Scale Industries' Association (KASSIA).

- Indian Institute of Plantation Management (IIPM) Bengaluru, in association with Royal Agricultural University, Cirencester, UK, Universiti Teknologi MARA, Malaysia and Faculty of Management Sciences, Suratthani Rajabhat University, Thailand, had organised a one-day International Conference on Challenges, Opportunities and Innovations in Agriculture, Plantations and Allied domanis posed by the Pandemic
- Defence minister inaugurated a three-day Indian Air Force (IAF) conclave to commemorate 50 years of India's victory in the 1971 India-Pakistan War, which is being celebrated as Swarnim Vijay Varsh in Bengaluru. It was held under theme 'Birth of a Nation: Congruence of Politico-Military Thoughts and Goals'.
- Teleindia Networks unveiled its greenfield hyperscale data centre DataSamudra in Bengaluru in line with the growing market demand and to offer value differentiation in data centre market.
- The Karnataka Religious Structures (Protection) Act, which was passed in the state
 assembly in September, has come into effect following the assent of Governor. It aims at
 Protection of religious constructions on a public place constructed before the date of
 commencement of this Act, in order to protect communal harmony and not hurt the
 religious sentiments of the public. It Defines an illegal religious structure as a "temple,
 church, mosque, gurudwara, Bodh vihar, Majar etc, constructed on a public place without
 authority of law
- Karnataka govt to set up fair price shops for every 100 ration cardholders
- All state-run temples and religious institutions under the Muzrai department have been directed to conduct a 'gau puja' on the occasion of Deepavali/Bali Padyami on November
 5.
- Mysuru Zoo gets orangutans. Orangutans were brought under an animal exchange scheme from Singapore and Malasiya
- The High Court of Karnataka on Thursday directed the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) to conduct tests of water samples from various locations in the limits of Mangaluru City Corporation and at the entry and exist points at Maravoor dam to ascertain the level of contamination caused due to mixing of leachate from the Pachchanady landfill site.
- Tourism Minister of Karnataka urges centre to develop Hampi under iconic tourist
 destination scheme. Iconic Tourist Destination Scheme is a central sector scheme
 under Tourism Ministry for the development of identified iconic destinations in the
 country following a holistic approach. Hampi was capital of vijayanagara empire
- Conservationists want the Karnataka government to appoint full-time RFO at Bhimgad Wildlife Sanctuary. Bhimgad Wildlife Sanctuary is in Khanapur Taluk of Belagavi District.

NATIONAL ISSUES

- Ministry of Labour and Employment launched DigiSaksham a digital skills programme to enhance the employability of youth by imparting digital skills that are required in an increasingly technology driven era. It is a joint initiative with Microsoft India.
- Ministry of Social Justice launched Senior Able Citizens for Re Employment in Dignity (SACRED) Portal. It aims at providing employment to Senior citizens.
- The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has extended the deadline till December 31 for NGOs to apply for renewal of their Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act (FCRA) registration certificates.
- The monsoon is likely to begin withdrawing from the mainland from October 6, said the India Meteorological Department as the country recorded an average of nearly 87 cm of rainfall across subdivisions, just short of the nearly 88 cm it normally receives during the monsoon.
- India has extended support for protecting the Antarctic environment and for cosponsoring the proposal of the European Union for designating East Antarctica and the Weddell Sea as Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) at a high-level ministerial meeting. An MPA is a protected area that provides protection for all or part of its natural resources. Certain activities within an MPA are limited or prohibited to meet specific conservation. It is designated by CCAMLR. Google Doodle celebrates SIVAJI GANESAN
- IFSCA, in its endeavour to develop the required eco-system has constituted an Expert
 Committee to recommend approach towards development of Sustainable Finance Hub
 and provide road map for the same. The expert committee is being chaired by Shri C.K.
 Mishra, Former Secretary to Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forest &
 Climate Change. The committee consists of leaders across the sustainable finance
 spectrum, including international agencies, standard setting bodies, funds, academia, and
 consultancies
- R. Sheikh assumed charge as first Director General of the Ordnance Directorate (Coordination and Services). It is the successor organization of Ordnance Factory Board (OFB).
- Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhari took over as The Chief of the Air Staff (CAS)





- NITI Aayog released a performance assessment report of district hospitals in India, titled Best Practices in the Performance of District Hospitals. The report is an outcome of collaboration with the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and WHO India. The National Accreditation Board for Hospitals and Healthcare Providers, a constituent board of the Quality Council of India, conducted the on-ground data validation.
- The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has simplified the process for Indians who want to renounce their citizenship. Citizenship act 1955 mentions ways of acquiring and termination of citizenship.
- Prime Minister launched the second phases of the Swachh Bharat Mission-Urban and the Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation. The Swachh Bharat Mission 2.0 intends to make India's cities garbage-free. AMRUT 2.0 aims at ramping up sewage treatment as well as providing 100 per cent water supply coverage to all households.
- Panchayati Raj Ministry launched People's Plan Campaign 2021- Sabki Yojana Sabka Vikas along with the Vibrant Gram Sabha Dashboard. It is a step to improve peoples participation in Panchayat
- The **Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (IBBI)** celebrated its Fifth Annual Day. It is insolvency regulatory body established under Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016.
- The centre will use Chacha Chaudhary, the popular comic book character, for sensitising children and youths about the cleaning of Ganga and other rivers under National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG)
- In a move to curb and abate the air pollution levels arising from the Construction and Demolition (C&D) activities in the National Capital Region (NCR), the Commission for Air Quality and Management (CAQM) will periodically review compliance of dust mitigation measures at Construction & Demolition sites in the National Capital Region
- Birth Anniversary of Lal Bahaddur Shastri celebrated.





- Canada marked its first ever National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on 1 october to honour the lost children and survivors of the country's indigenous residential schools, their families and communities. The aim of the holiday is to educate and remind the citizens of the history of indigenous children and remember their suffering. All citizens were encouraged to wear the colour orange to highlight how indigenous children were robbed of their culture and freedoms.
- All India Institute of Ayurveda (AIIA), under the AYUSH ministry, has developed "Bal Raksha Kit" which is an immunity boosting kit.
- "Nata-Sankirtana" festival was started at the Mandap of Jawaharlal Nehru Manipur Dance Academy (JNMDA), Imphal. In classical Ragas, Nata sankirtana is a hymn of lord Krishna that synthesizes seevral indigenous rhythms. Sankirtana follows a strict code in its performance with rhythms pattern and costumes that are determined by specific rules & regulation. Sankirtana is performed to mark important occasions in person's life such as from birth to death. UNESCO had recognized Manipur Nata Sankirtana in 2013.
- India's highest science award called "Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar Award 2021" was presented to the 11 scientists on the occasion of 80th foundation day of Council for Scientific & Industrial Research (CSIR).
- The Council Of Scientific And Industrial Research -National Geophysical Research Institute (CSIR-NGRI) has launched an 'Environmental Seismology' group to develop a 'Landslide and Flood Early Warning System' for the Himalayan region based on real-time

monitoring with dense seismological networks, coupled with satellite data, numerical modelling and geomorphic analysis.

- A British-era bungalow on a hillock that used to be the 17th century military office of the Ahom rulers has been converted into a heritage centre depicting life along the Brahmaputra. It has been named Mahabahu Brahmaputra River Heritage Centre.
- Election commission of India allots election symbols to parties for By poll elections in Bihar. It is allotted in terms of Election Symbols (Reservation and Allotment) Order of 1968.

- Researchers at the **Central University of Kerala** (CUK) have found that **domestication of sheep** had taken place in the Indian subcontinent, especially in **Indus Valley civilisation** regions in the 6th or 7th millennium BC.
- Ministry of culture to provide financial push to Buddhist circuit. Buddhist Circuit was announced in 2016, Under the Ministry of Tourism's flagship Swadesh Darshan scheme. Sites - Bodh Gaya, Nalanda, Rajgir, Viashali, Sarnath, Shravasti, Kushinagar, Kaushambi, Sankisa and Kapilavastu.

- India joins HIGH AMBITION COALITION (HAC) FOR NATURE AND PEOPLE. It is a group of more than 70 countries encouraging the adoption of the global goal to protect 30×30, which aims to halt the accelerating loss of species, and protect vital ecosystems that are the source of our economic security.
- Death anniversary of freedom fighter Jayaprakash Narayan recently celebrated.





- **Jim Corbett National Park**, a world-renowned tiger reserve in Uttarakhand, may be renamed as Ramganga National Park in the future.
- The 5th edition of the **bilateral maritime exercise JIMEX**, **between Japan and India**, was conducted in the Arabian Sea from 06 08 October 2021.
- International Financial Services Centres Authority (IFSCA) and GIFT City launched I-Sprint'21, the global FinTech Hackathon Series of IFSCA on 7th October 2021 at 11.30 AM IST. The first Sprint of the series "Sprint01: BankTech" is focussed on FinTechs for the Banking sector.
- National Mission of Clean Ganga (NMCG) has signed an MoU with Water, Sanitation and Hygiene Institute (WASH Institute) to conduct a series of trainings to enhance the quality of service of officials in Urban Local Bodies (ULBs).
- In a interview the representative and country director of the United Nations World Food Programme (WFP), Bishow Parajuli, said Eliminating social taboos with regard to food diversification is crucial for improving nourishment levels among the Indian population. World Food Programme is the food assistance branch of the United Nations and the world's largest humanitarian organization addressing hunger and promoting food security launched in 1961(1963 in India)
- The Labor Bureau released the results of the All-India Quarterly Establishment-based Employment Survey (QES) for the first quarter (FQ) of 2021 (April to June).
- The Delhi government, in a move to provide an alternative to stubble burning and combat air pollution, will start its campaign to use bio-decomposer PUSA solution on farmlands under its winter action plan. The decomposer was developed by Indian Agriculture Research Institute (IARI). It is essentially a fungi-based liquid solution that can soften hard stubble to the extent that it can be easily mixed with soil in the field to act as compost.
- Based on research over KATOL meteorite researchers have unravelled the composition expected to be present in the Earth's lower mantle which is at about 660 km deep. It reports existance of new mineral called BRIDGMANITE, which is present in Earth's lower mantle around 80%
- Popular since the early 20th century, the rail link between Nepal and India is ready to resume on the neighbouring country's first-ever broad gauge passenger service. The first stretch is ready: a 34-km line between **Bihar's Jayanagar and Nepal's Kurtha**, with the Hindu pilgrimage city of Janakpur Dham in between.
- The second phase of the Malabar naval war gaming exercise with the four Quad members
 India, US, Japan and Australia will take place in the Bay of Bengal from October 12 till
 October 15.
- A recent analysis by the Mahamana Centre of Excellence in Climate Change Research (MCECCR) at Banaras Hindu University (BHU), in collaboration with the Department of Science and Technology and the Ministry of Earth Sciences, has found a spatial shift of heatwaves in India, with this weather event now occurring in new regions in the country.
- 300th birth anniversary of **Bhai Taru Singh Ji** celebrated. Bhai Taru Singh (1720 1745) was a prominent Sikh martyr known for sacrificing his life, in the name of protecting Sikh values, by having had his head scalped rather than cutting his hair and converting to Islam. Gurdwara Shaheed Bhai Taru Singh or Gurdwara Shahidi Asthan Bhai Taru Singh ji is a Sikh

Gurdwara at Naulakha Bazaar in Lahore, Pakistan, which commemorates the spot where Bhai Taru Singh was martyred.

Rajasthan's marriage registration Bill passed last month by the Rajasthan
Assembly, which amended a 2009 law on mandatory registration of marriages, including child marriages, has been embroiled in controversy. It has been criticized for registration of child marriage

- Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences awarded the Sveriges Riksbank Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel 2021 — often incorrectly referred to as the Nobel Prize in Economics — to three US-based economists.
- 28th anniversary of NHRC recently celebrated. It is a statutory body established on 12th October, 1993 Under the Protection of Human Rights Act (PHRA), 1993.
- Retail inflation falls to 4.35% in September



- The Prime Minister has paid tributes to cartoonist **RK Laxman** on his 100th birth anniversary




- Govt panel chaired by Union Education Minister is all set to oversee

- Najla Bouden Romdhane has become the first female prime minister of Tunisia
- **Russia** has successfully test-fired Hypersonic missile from a nuclear submarine for the first time on October 4, 2021. The missile, named **Zircon missile**, was launched from the Severodvinsk. submarine. Zircon hit a designated target in the Barents Sea.
- Japan's parliament on Monday elected Fumio Kishida, as Prime Minister.
- U.S. scientists David Julius and Ardem Patapoutian on Monday won the Nobel Medicine
 Prize for discoveries on receptors for temperature and touch.
- World Animal Welfare Day is observed all over the world every year on October 4.
- United Arab Emirates (UAE) announced its plan to send a probe on an asteroid between
 Mars and Jupiter for collecting data regarding origins of the universe.
- French President unveiled a five-year, €30 billion (\$35 billion) investment plan for developing innovative technology and industrial activity, including building small nuclear reactors, electric cars and greener airplanes.
- China has pledged to inject \$233 million into a new fund to protect biodiversity in developing countries, despite disagreements among major donors on the initiative.
- Prime Minister of India participated virtually in the G20 Extraordinary Summit on Afghanistan. The Meeting was convened by Italy, which currently holds the G20 Presidency
- World Standards Day is observed on 14 October annually
- Museum Rietberg, based in Zurich, Switzerland, has established a unique research centre and fellowship programme with a focus on Indian art. The GBF Centre is meant for scholars, curators, and artists who specialise in Indian painting. The GBF Centre has named Sonika Soni as its first research fellow.
- Japan's new prime minister Fumio Kishida on Friday unveiled a flagship council, which will be responsible for strategizing how to tackle wealth disparities and redistribute wealth to households
- A Russian actress and a film director returned to Earth on Sunday after spending 12 days on the International Space Station (ISS) shooting scenes for the first movie in orbit.
- India, Israel, the United Arab Emirates and the United States have decided to launch a new quadrilateral economic forum
- The **Financial Action Task Force (FATF)** retained **Pakistan in the 'greylist'**. Pakistan is needed to further demonstrate that investigations and prosecutions were being pursued against the senior leadership of UN-designated terror groups, which include the Lashkare-Taiba (LeT), Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM), al-Qaeda and the Taliban.
- Journalist Maria Ressa from the Philippines is one of two journalists to have been awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for 2021, along with Russian Editor Dmitry Muratov. Ms. Ressa, who is the author of upcoming book How to Stand Up to a Dictator speaks about her battles with the Philippines Government and 'Big Tech' social media companies. It is



not since 1935 that the Nobel Peace Prize went to a journalist. Carl Von Ossietzky, who wrote about the Nazi regime and Germany's remilitarisation plan, won that year.

- Hurricane Rick to hit Coast of Mexico. The US National Hurricane Centre said Rick had winds as high as 85 miles per hour (140 kph) and was expected to hit somewhere around the seaport of Lazaro Cardenas and the resort of Zihuatanejo. Hurricanes are large, swirling storms that produce winds of 119 kilometers per hour (74 mph) or higher that form over warm ocean waters.
- The Center for Strategic and International Studies notes that hunger in Afghanistan has increased substantially since 2014 due to major droughts, floods and economic and security challenges.
- Amid the military standoff with India in eastern Ladakh, China's national legislature 23,
 2021, adopted a new Land Border Law for the protection of the land border areas
