### **News in Short**



## KARNATAKA ISSUES



- **Ramanagar** district administration is planning to launch "seri-tourism" in association with the tourism department
- Karnataka Forest Department has deployed a sniffer dog to detect wildlife crimes in Biligiri Ranganathaswamy Temple (BRT) Tiger Reserve in Chamarajanagar. The German Shepherd named Jhansi underwent a seven-month training at Chandigarh by the Indo-Tibetan Border Police Force.
- The High Court of Karnataka quashed the State Government's 2019 notification of handing over **Yelahanka Puttenahalli Lake Bird Conservation Reserve** to the Bruhat Bangalore Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) for maintenance. Court is of the opinion that Chief Wildlife Warden is the competent authority to control, manage and maintain the bird conservation reserve who is appointed under Wildlife Protection Act
- 'Grama One' service was launched in 100 villages in Karnataka's Davanagere district as a pilot project and now it is expected to be launched in more villages by the e-governance department and revenue department. It is Envisaged to be a single-point assistance centre for all citizen-centric activities at the village level which include G2C services, banking services, RTI queries and so on
- Bengaluru residents complain about glitches in Sahaya 2.0 redressal app. It is a app by Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike where citizens to register their grievances where the grievance modules of Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike, BESCOM, BWSSB, BMTC, BMRCL, BMRDA and BDA
- Karnataka Chief Minister told the Centre that the state is opposed to the implementation of the Kasturirangan Committee report on Western Ghats. The committee recommended instead of the total area of Western Ghats, only 37% (i.e. 60,000 sq. km.) of the total area be brought under ESA
- The **Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP)** is in charge of 204 lakes here, of which only 20 lakes are free from any encroachments, data released by the civic body itself revealed
- The State Election Commission (SEC) moved the Karnataka High Court against the state government for passing the Karnataka Gram Swaraj and Panchayat Raj (Amendment) Act, 2021. The new law takes away powers earlier conferred on SEC for fixing the number of seats, carrying out the exercise of delimitation, and fixing the reservation of seats for TPs and ZPs
- Around 130 contractual employees of the Indian Telephone Industries Limited (ITI) have been agitating against the company after they were terminated from service. The ITI is a



public sector undertaking (PSU) company headquartered in Bengaluru under the Department of Telecommunication, Ministry of Communication, Government of India.

- The Karnataka State Legal Services Authority (KSLSA) will soon start a Legal Services Clinic in Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) to resolve grievances related to property khata and other issues by offering free legal assistance to citizens.
- Researchers at the **Indian Institute of Science (IISc.)** and their collaborators have identified a key role played by hydrogen sulphide (H2S) gas in suppressing the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV).Increased H2S was found to have a direct effect on reducing the rate at which the virus multiplies in HIV-infected human immune cells.
- The BMTC, in collaboration with the Building and Construction Workers Welfare Board, is issuing **Sahayahasta bus passes**, which can be used for free travel, to **construction workers** registered with the board.
- With 94.57% of the 4.89 crore eligible population in the State having been jabbed with the first dose, Karnataka has moved up to the first position among larger States in terms of first dose vaccination.Karnataka, which stood in the third position in first dose administration till a week ago, is now followed by Gujarat and Madhya Pradesh where 94.46% and 93.83% of the target population has been covered with one dose, according to data from CoWIN.
- To ease tax burden on industries and encourage entrepreneurs to set up units, the State Cabinet decided to create a separate slab of property tax to be levied on industries/industrial areas developed by KIADB and KSSIDC falling under urban local bodies (ULBs) This will be done by bringing in amendments to the Karnataka Municipal Corporations Act, 1976, and the Karnataka Municipalities Act, 1964
- Noted Kannada writer Rajeshwari Tejaswi, wife of renowned literateur late KP Poornachandra Tejaswi passed & The daughter-in-law of Rashtrakavi Kuvempu, Rajeshwari (84)
- The Karnataka Appellate Tribunal (KAT) should try to adjudicate cases filed before it as quickly as possible, especially in matters pertaining to notices against illegal constructions, the High Court of Karnataka has said. KAT is established under K.A.T Acts of 1976, is Common Appellate Authority for the Revenue Department, Department of Co-operation & the Commercial Taxes Department attached to the Revenue Department.
- Sandur Tahasildar was relieved under premise of **Breach of Privilege**. Right and immunity enjoyed by legislatures, in which legislators are granted protection against civil or criminal liability for actions done or statements made in the course of their legislative duties. It is decided as per **Article 194 in State legislatures**.
- Karnataka, unveiled the e-sahamathi platform, a consent-driven system that authorities say will give citizens complete control on sharing their personal data with private



companies. Private or public companies and nonprofits willing to use the **e-sahamathi platform** to access citizen data will have to pay a one-time registration fee of Rs 50,000.

- Prize money for gallantry awardees hiked fivefold in Karnataka. Prize money for **Paramveer Chakra awardees** that was earlier Rs 25 lakh has been increased to Rs 1.50 crore
- **BBMP** has drawn out a **Index** to highlight the **roads that need repair**. It is a colour-coded index based on the extent of damage and present condition.
- Dharwad tops Karnataka with maximum area-wise crop loss due to heavy rains followed by Belgaum and Tumakuru
- Karnataka recorded a sudden rise in the number of **adverse events following immunisation (AEFI)**. AEFI is Any untoward medical occurrence which follows immunization and which does not necessarily have a causal relationship with the usage of the vaccine.
- **Tata Group** may lose control over 942-acre tea estate in Karnataka. It is in accordance with a local court judgement. Tata Coffee's petition to get the description of the land reversed to **'redeemed sagu'** in revenue records from its 2008 entry as 'forest' was dismissed recently
- Karnataka has begun issuing BH ('Bharat') series of registration numbers for a select group
  of vehicle owners, to enable smooth transfer of government employees from one state
  to another. A vehicle bearing BH registration mark shall not require assignment of a new
  registration mark when the owner of the vehicle shifts from one State to another
- The Karnataka Assembly passed four Bills, including one that proposes to upgrade the iconic University Visvesvaraya College of Engineering (UVCE) into an autonomous institution like an IIT. Sir M Visvesvaraya in 1917, is currently a constituent college of the Bangalore University.
- The Indian Institute of Management Bangalore (IIMB) has been re-accredited for five years by EQUIS. EQUIS is an institutional assessment, improvement and accreditation system for business and management schools This is the second time that IIMB has received accreditation for five years, the longest period that EQUIS offer
- Karnataka ranked among the top states for the highest disposal rates of workplace sexual harassment cases filed against government officials. Complaints were registered at the Sexual Harassment Electronic Box (SHe-Box), the online complaint system mandated under the 'The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013
- The BBMP, which has resumed repairing broken roads after a long gap, plans to use the **micro-surfacing technology** to improve the **motorability of six stretches**. The new method of road repair, touted to provide a smooth road surface, involves a mixture of just three to six millimetres of bitumen aggregate along with asphalt emulsion.

 Government of Karnataka would increase the compensation for crop loss in dry land from ₹6,800 to ₹13,500 per hectare while the compensation for irrigated crops would go up from ₹13,600 to ₹25,000 per hectare.The compensation for herticultural crops would increase from ₹18,000 to

compensation for horticultural crops would increase from ₹18,000 to ₹28,000 per hectare.

- Karnataka government to convince Centre on **ST tag for Kaadu Gollas**. It is as per Article 340
- BMTC started VANITA SANGATI programme. It is a scheme by state government to issue Free bus pass for garment workers
- Two earthquakes of magnitude 2.9 and 3.0 were recorded in Chickballapur by the Karnataka State Natural Disaster Monitoring Centre
- The Bangalore Electricity Supply Company Limited (BESCOM) has launched the 'EV Mithra' app to help residents locate electric-vehicle (EV) charging stations in the city.
- The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) has accredited city-based Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous) with A++ grade. It is the second institution in the country and the first in Karnataka to have achieved the highest CGPA.
- Centre has asked the Karnataka government to complete the construction of 2.02 crore houses under **Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana- Gramin** (PMAY-G), by August 15, 2022
- The Karnataka government announced a reduction of the tax levied on **Aviation Turbine Fuel (ATF)** from the existing 28% to 18%.
- Plans afoot to **uproot Invasive lantana bushes from BRT reserve, Bandipur** in Karnataka. They are native of America
- Karnataka Renewable Energy Development Ltd. (KREDL) was awarded the first prize in National Energy Conservation 2021 in the category of State performance awards (Group-1) sector.
- A new technology accelerator and incubation centre was launched at the CSIR-NAL campus in Bengaluru to nurture aerospace start-ups.
- Sachivalaya Vahini portal of Karnataka government taken down. It will be replaced soon. It was used by legislators to address issues of locals
- BMTC to induct E-Buses and BSVI buses to its fleet
- State government has decided to extend the **Raitha Vidya Nidhi scheme** for girl students of Classes VIII and IX standard. Launched in August 2021 the scheme supports the children of farmers in the state for higher education
- The **animal adoption fee** in zoos across Karnataka has been hiked. A decision in this regard was taken at the 149th board meeting of the **Zoo Authority of Karnataka (ZAK)**, which controls the zoos in the State. The species have been categorized in diamond class, gold class, silver class, and bronze class. The adoption is possible for a sum of ₹1,000 to ₹3,00,000 per annum.
- Karnataka has designed a new technology platform that will not only allow online applications for welfare schemes, but also score citizens to determine who needs a benefit the most, a move that will come in handy when there are too many applicants. The platform is named **Suvidha**, functions directly under Chief Minister

• In a move that will help thousands of families living in protected forest areas that are not declared as tiger reserves, the Forest Department of Karnataka has proposed to enhance the **relocation package** per family



from Rs 10 lakh to Rs 15 lakh. As per the guidelines issued by the **National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA),** families choosing to move out of a core area can opt for a financial package or accept the rehabilitation arranged by the Forest department. This is to avoid Man-animal conflict

- Governance department of Karnataka has partnered with the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) and State Bank of India (SBI) for enabling and implementing 'e-RUPI'. E-RUPI is a electronic voucher based digital payment system "e-RUPI" developed by the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI)
- The draft active mobility Bill has been published by the **Directorate of Urban Land Transport (DULT)**. It aims to protect the rights of pedestrians and cyclists to safe, accessible, and connected pedestrian and cycling networks in urban areas in the State
- Birth anniversary of **Kuvempu** recently celebrated(29 December)
- Efforts are on to include the Buddhist site excavated in and around Sannati, on the banks of the Bhima in Chittapur taluk of Kalaburagi district, in the World Heritage site list of UNESCO
- S.T. Bhoopal, former Mysore University footballer and well-known administrator, passed away
- Former Karnataka chief justice N K Sodhi passes away

## NATIONAL ISSUES



- More than six lakh Indians renounced citizenship in the past five years, the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) informed the Lok Sabha. It is done in accordance of Citizenship Act, 1955
- The **Uttarakhand Government** recently withdrew the **Char Dham Devasthanam Management Act.** It was legislated in 2019 for management of char dham temples through the board
- Admiral R Hari Kumar took charge as the new chief of the Indian Navy after incumbent Admiral Karambir Singh retired from service.
- An international team of researchers has discovered a **new marine reptile**. The specimen, a metre-long skull, has been named **Kyhytysuka sachicarum**.
- Twitter's new CEO Parag Agrawal, at 37 years of age, has become the youngest CEO leading an S&P 500 company, only slightly younger than Meta Platform Inc CEO Mark Zuckerberg. Agrawal, a graduate from the Indian Institute of Technology-Bombay's 2005 batch, replaced Twitter co-founder Jack Dorsey, who stepped down from the executive role.
- The average contribution of stubble burning to **Delhi's PM2.5 level** in November was 14.6%, according to data from the government-run monitoring agency **SAFAR** (System of Air Quality and Weather Forecasting and Research).
- The World Health Organization has classified a new variant of the novel coronavirus, which belongs to a lineage named B.1.1.529, as a 'variant of concern', and named is **Omicron**.
- **Nagaland** is celebrating its **59th Statehood Day** this year 2021.Nagaland was granted statehood on **December 1, 1963**, with Kohima being declared as its capital. The state has experienced insurgency, as well as an inter-ethnic conflict, since the 1950s.
- PM condoles the passing away of renowned Telugu film lyricist Sirivennela Seetharama Sastry
- On **1 December 1965**, India's first line of defense, the **Border Security Force (BSF)** was formed.
- Gujarat has pipped Maharashtra to emerge the largest manufacturing hub in the country
- The Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment has formulated a scheme "SMILE Support for Marginalized Individuals for Livelihood and Enterprise", which includes subscheme – "Comprehensive Rehabilitation of persons engaged in the act of Begging". This scheme covers several comprehensive measures including welfare measures for persons, who are engaged in the act of begging. The focus of the scheme is extensively on rehabilitation, provision of medical facilities, counseling, basic documentation, education, skill development, economic linkages and so on.
- As part of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' to celebrate 75 years of Independence, REC Limited, a public infrastructure finance company under the Ministry of Power organized a 'Bijli Utsav' in Sonapur village of Kamrup district and adjoining villages in Assam

- Chief Minister has sought the NITI Aayog's assistance in getting **special status for Andhra Pradesh.** Special Status is guaranteed by the Constitution through an Act that has to be passed by 2/3rds majority in both the houses of Parliament that empowers legislative and political rights
- The Centre has **extended the timeline** for the implementation of the **Smart Cities Mission to June 2023**. Reason cited being Pandemic. It was launched by MOHUA in 2015 for Developing **citizen-friendly and self-sustainable urban settlements**
- Victory of India in 1971 war is being commemorated. This war led to creation of independent country of Bangladesh
- President of India Pays Homage to **Dr Rajendra Prasad** on His Birth Anniversary. He was first President of India
- Indian-American Gita Gopinath, the chief economist of International Monetary Fund, is being promoted as IMF's First Deputy Managing Director
- PM inaugurated INFINITY FORUM, a fintech initiative of International Financial Services Centres Authority. It is a Flagship financial technology event uniting the world's leading minds in policy, business, and technology to explore and advance the biggest ideas in FinTech
- An increase in discharge of sewage from cities and towns has resulted in the **deterioration** of water quality in the Periyar, according to the Kerala State Pollution Control Board. It is the **longest river of Kerala** and called as **Lifeline of Kerala**
- Longest migration route of **lesser florican** from Rajasthan tracked. The latest instance of migration detection is that of a male lesser florican covering a distance of 1,000 km from its breeding ground was recorded.
- Opening Ceremony of Gateway of India is being celebrated. The gateway was opened on 4th December 1924, by the Viceroy, the Earl of Reading
- Cyclone Jawad to bring heavy rain to Odisha, Bengal and A.P.
- Every year the **Indian Navy Day** is celebrated on **December 4**. This year the Indian Navy Day is celebrated on the following theme " Indian Navy Combat Ready, Credible and Cohesive".

- 11th Edition of Exercise EKUVERIN between India & Maldives will be conducted at Kadhdhoo Island, Maldives from 06 to 19 December 2021.
- PM condoles the passing away of former Andhra Pradesh CM Shri K. Rosaiah
- Buoyed by the success of its innovative Project RE-HAB (Reducing Elephant-Human Attacks using Bees) in Karnataka, Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) has now replicated the project in Assam. "Bee-fences" are created by setting up bee boxes in the passage ways of elephants to block their entrance to human territories.
- A copy of the Bhagavad Gita, a Parker pen, a Gandhi topi (cap) and a tulsi mala are some of the personal effects of **former Prime Minister Morarji Desai** that will make their way to the Museum of Prime Ministers, New Delhi
- Kazhuveli notified as 16th bird sanctuary in Tamil Nadu. It is declared by Governor on advice of State government as per recommendations of Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Chief Wildlife Warden under Wildlife conservation act 1972
- A tiny snail with a golden-yellow shell found in the Edappally canal in Kochi has been flagged as an invasive species. It is named as **PHYSELLA ACUTA**. A invasive species is one that is not native to a specific location and has a tendency to spread to a degree believed to cause damage to the environment, human economy or human health.
- Researchers have developed a chewing gum that they say can potentially reduce transmission of the SARS-CoV-2 coronavirus. The chewing gum is laced with a plant-grown protein, which serves as a "trap" for the virus. The chewing gum targets the virus in the saliva, and does so by trapping it with the ACE2 protein.
- Afforestation funds released to States by CAMPA. Every time forest land is diverted for non-forest purposes such as mining or industry, the user agency pays for planting forests over an equal area of non-forest land, or when such land is not available, twice the area of degraded forest land. The funds can be used for various purposes

- A Curtain Raiser Event for Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief exercise, **PANEX-21**, for the member nations of BIMSTEC countries, was held recently
- To improve leadership skills of grassroot women political leaders, the **National Commission for Women (NCW)** launched a pan-India capacity building programme, 'She is a Changemaker' for women representatives at all levels, gram panchayats to parliament members and political workers including office bearers of National/State political parties.
- A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is entered on 2nd November, 2021 between Ministry of Rural Development and Flipkart Internet Pvt. Ltd. to allow the Self Help Groups (SHGs) producers including the artisans, weavers and craftsmen to access national markets through the Flipkart Samarth programme.
- **Bhasha Sangam** is a mobile app, developed in both Android and iOS platforms, to give users familiarity with common expressions of daily conversation in Scheduled Indian languages. The app aims to foster the spirit of Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat by enabling people across India to learn different languages of different states of India and come closer to their culture.
- Cabinet extends PMAY-Rural plan till March 2024. It aims at providing a pucca house, with basic amenities, to all houseless householder and those households living in kutcha and dilapidated house
- The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) of the Reserve Bank of India kept key policy rates unchanged. Policy rates include repo rate, reverse repo rate etc
- The Indian Institute of Plantation Management, Bengaluru, (IIPMB), celebrated its 29th foundation day. HQ in Bengaluru, it is an autonomous institution under Ministry of Commerce, Government of India set up in 1993 to provide professional management education in the field of plantations and associated agribusiness sector
- Two species of plants first collected by botanists more than 125 years ago from Meghalaya and the Andaman Islands are now extinct in the wild.
- The Union Cabinet approved the funding and implementation of the **Ken-Betwa river** interlinking project. The Project aims to transfer surplus water from the Ken river in MP to Betwa in UP
- NASA launched its new Laser Communications Relay Demonstration (LCRD) the agency's first-ever laser communications system from Cape Canaveral Space Force Station in Florida.
- The Prime Minister has paid tributes to **Sri Guru Teg Bahadur Ji** on his martyrdom day.He was the 9<sup>th</sup> sikh guru
- Chief of Defence Staff **General Bipin Rawat** and his wife Madhulika Rawat have been confirmed to be among the 13 people who died in the IAF Mi-17V5 helicopter crash near Coonoor in Tamil Nadu
- Assamese poet Nilmani Phookan Jr has won the 56th Jnanpith Award, and Konkani novelist Damodar Mauzo has won the 57th Jnanpith Award. It is the highest literary award of India
- PM congratulates H. E. Olaf Scholz on being elected as Federal Chancellor of Germany

- Ahmedabad-based Balkrishna Doshi will receive the Royal Gold Medal
   2022 by the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA), the world's highest honour for architecture.
- The performance of Centre's **Beti Bachao**, **Beti Padhao Scheme** in the states has not been up to the mark, the Committee on Empowerment of Women has said in its latest report. The scheme was started in 2015 to promote gender equality
- More than One Lakh pensioners are currently being serviced by Principal Controller of Communication Accounts/ Controller of Communication Accounts offices all over India via SAMPANN project that provides direct credit of pension into the bank accounts of pensioners
- India's retail inflation accelerated in Nov. to 5.1%. Retail Inflation, refers to the rate of inflation based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) which is an index that tracks the daily consumption of households and the change in the price of the goods and services these households spend on.
- H5N1 influenza outbreak reported in Kerala. H5N1 virus causes a highly infectious, severe respiratory disease in birds


- Union Government is working on a plan to use stubble as a **biofuel** and manure as part of an effort to deal with stubble burning. Biofuels are hydrocarbon fuel produced from an organic matter
- The UN General Assembly has conferred Observer Status on the International Solar Alliance (ISA). It is a Alliance of more than 122 countries initiated by India with most of them being sunshine countries, which lie either completely or partly between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn
- Karnataka won in Elite Group B of the Vijay Hazare Trophy cricket tournament
- Kerala Governor has expressed desire to quit as chancellor of a state university. In most cases, the Governor of the state is the ex-officio chancellor of the universities in that state.
- An ancient Indian idol of a goddess missing from a temple in Uttar Pradesh, presumed stolen over 40 years ago, will soon find its way back home to India after it was discovered in a garden in a country home in England. The Yogini, which refers to the divine feminine in Hinduism, dates back to the 8th century and went missing from the village of Lokhari in Banda district around the late 1970s and early 1980s.
- Prime Minister paid deposit insurance to depositors who could not access their money as their banks faced financial crises. It is providing insurance protection to the depositor's money by receiving a premium by Deposit Insurance and Credit Guarantee Corporation (DICGC) under RBI to protect depositors if a bank fails.
- India International Science Festival (IISF) is an annual event considered to be the biggest platform in the country which brings together students, the public, researchers, innovators and artists from around the globe. PCA was ontroduced by RBI in 2002 is structured early-intervention mechanism for banks that become undercapitalised due to poor asset quality, or vulnerable due to loss of profitability.
- The Centre has approached the Supreme Court seeking modification of its order directing that all transmission cables in the habitat of the **Great Indian Bustard (GIB)** be laid underground. It is state animal of Rajasthan

- The Supreme Court allowed **Maharashtra to hold the traditional bullock cart** racing event, saying there was no reason to disallow it in the state when similar sports were going on in other places across the country.
- The Jharkhand government launched the Safe and Responsible Migration Initiative (SRMI) to enable systemic registration of migrant workers for monitoring and analysis in the source as well as the destination districts. - An Indian desert cat has been spotted for the first time in Madhya Pradesh's Panna Tiger Reserve (PTR). They are cats found in deserts and can survive without water
- Nearly 2,000 pet and stray dogs in Amravati city were affected by **canine parvovirus virus.** Highly contagious viral disease with no vaccine
- DRDO successfully tests nuclear-capable Agni Prime missile from APJ Abdul Kalam Island off the coast of Odisha. New generation advanced variant of the Agni class of missiles. It is Surface-to-surface ballistic missile



- One-year celebrations of the Bodoland Territorial Region Council (BTR) was recently held. The second Bodo accord, 2003 led to the formation of the Bodoland Territorial Council (BTC) under the provisions of the Sixth Schedule of the Constitution
- 60th anniversary of the **liberation of Goa** was celebrated. The Liberation of Goa was a military action undertaken with code-named **Operation Vijay** by the Indian Armed Forces involved air, sea and land strikes for over 36 hours during which Goa, territories of Diu, Daman were liberated from 450 years of Portuguese rule in 1961
- **Delhi** hosted the Grand Finale of **All India Vande Bharatam, Nritya Utsav**. Objective is to Select the top dancing talent from across the country and Provide them the opportunity to perform during the Republic Day Parade 2022
- India's K. Srikanth's won Silver BWF World badminton championship. He is the first male to win the title

- Hyderabad Strikers won Tennis Premier League of India

For the first time, the commission proposed reserving nine seats for Scheduled Tribes (STs) on the basis of population. Seven seats are proposed for the Scheduled Caste (SC) community. 
