KARNATAKA ISSUES

- Seeking to honour **Puneeth Rajkumar** who was a role model for youths with his dignified conduct, simplicity and social service, the government has named the podium of **'Udyami Aagu, Udyoga Needu'** after the late actor.
- Basti Vaman Shenoy, founder of World Konkani Centre, Mangaluru, passed away on due to age-related illness.
- Close on the heels of Durga Puja being accorded the **UNESCO** intangible cultural heritage tag, Karnataka is set to initiate the process to secure a similar status for **Mysuru Dasara**.
- The Directorate of Urban Land Transport has opened first Pedal Port at the Dr B R
 Ambedkar metro station's exit near Vidhana Soudha. The project was piloted at Church
 Street when it was made pedestrian-friendly last year. It is a first-of-its-kind initiative
 where cycle pumps and tools such as tyre levers, Allen keys, screwdrivers, and spanners
 are available for self-service. Cyclists can fix their cycle tyre punctures, fill air or even
 tighten seat posts
- Bengaluru will get Rs 6,000 crore over three years under the Chief Minister's Amrit Nagarotthana scheme for infrastructure development. This is the third phase of the scheme
- Hindustan Aeronautics Intermediate Jet Trainer (IJT), designed and developed by HAL for the stage-2 training of Indian Air Force pilots, has successfully demonstrated its ability to carry out six-turn spins to the right-hand and left-hand sides.
- For providing more facilities for tourists at the Jog Falls, where water from river Sharavati
 takes a plunge from a height of 810 feet, the State Cabinet on Thursday decided to
 construct a ropeway, a five-star hotel, coffee bars and other facilities on Design-BuildFinance-Operate-Transfer (DBFOT) model. In this model, the entire responsibility for the
 design, construction, finance, and operation of the project for the period of concession
 lies with the private party.
- The High Court of Karnataka has upheld the amendments made to the **Karnataka Essential Commodities Public Distribution System (Control) Order 2017**, fixing minimum educational qualification and period of extension of dealership of fair price shops.
- Karnataka government launches "The Kutumba project". It aims to be a comprehensive database to create an Integrated Social Protection System (ISPS) consisting of a Social Registry and an Entitlement Management System that the government wants to use for automatic disbursal of benefits to eligible citizens without them having to even apply.
- Chief Minister of Karnataka said irrigation projects in Karnataka are bogged down by inter-State river water disputes and asked the Centre to "revisit the Inter-State River Water Disputes Act since the law is creating more disputes than resolving them."
- Institute for Social and Economic Change celebrates mark its golden jubilee. It is a Social science research institute situated in Bengaluru, Helping in formulating policies in various social and economic sectors, which contributed to the upliftment of weaker sections in Karnataka



- Karnataka government celebrates death anniversary of Dr Shivakumara
 Swamiji as Dasoha Day on January 21 every year
- Government of Karnataka celebrated the birth anniversary of Ambigara Chaudayya on 21 Janauary.

- Three students from Bengaluru and Mangaluru were awarded the Pradhan Mantri Rashtriya Bal Puraskar. Children will be awarded the 'Pradhan Mantri Rashtriya Bal Puraskar' for their exceptional abilities and outstanding accomplishments.
- The Karnataka government's ambitious **Grama One initiative** that seeks to eliminate middlemen and provide various departments' services in the rural areas of 12 districts was launched on Republic Day.
- Death anniversary of Sangolli Rayanna was observed recently
- Karnataka Bank has launched mobile banking facility to its NRI customers through its existing mobile banking application 'KBL MobilePlus' app.
- The Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Chest Diseases (RGICD), Bengaluru has been declared as the designated facility to treat Influenza-Like Illness (ILI) and Severe Acute Respiratory Illnesses (SARI).

- Karnataka has raised objections on Hogenakkal project saying Tamil Nadu cannot go ahead with any scheme that utilises Cauvery water without its concurrence. Originally conceived in the 1960s, the Hogenakkal project saw the light of day only in 2013. Under the first phase, 160 MLD of potable water is supplied to the drought-prone districts of Dharmapuri and Krishnagiri.

- GST Council's 46th meeting was held recently. It is a constitutional body for making recommendations to the Union and State Government on issues related to Goods and Service Tax formed under Article 279-A
- Defence Minister inaugurated 27 projects built by the Border Roads Organisation (BRO)
 recently. It is in south Ladakh connecting Chisumle and Demchok, passes through a pass
 known as Umling La (height of over 19,000 feet)
- POWERGRID celebrated anniversary of One Nation-One Grid-One Frequency. It is the Administrator of Transmission of Power
- India steamroll Sri Lanka by 9 wickets for eighth U-19 Asia Cup title
- Director General VS Pathania, took over as the 24th Chief of Indian Coast Guard

- **Delhi Assembly** passed an amendment Bill to the Delhi Sikh Gurdwara Act, 1971, recognising **Takht Damdama Sahib** as the fifth **Takht of Sikhs**.It is in Bhatinda. A Takht, which means a throne and is Seat of temporal authority for Sikh
- PM inaugurated Maharaja Bir Bikram Airport in Tripura. MAHARAJA BIR BAKAM
 MANIKYA KISHORE was King of Tripura from 1923 to 1947 & Belonged to Manikaya
 dynasty. He was a enlightened and benevolent ruler and is considered the father of
 modern architecture in Tripura
- Mud Crab Reovirus (MCRV) has been found to be the reason for the mass mortality of crabs (Scylla serrate) in Andhra Pradesh.
- P-8I aircraft began operations from the INS Hansa Naval Air Base in Goa
- **Sindhutai Sapkal**, Social worker and Padma Shri awardee, passes away at 74. Overcoming circumstances, Sindhutai Sapkal soon started working for the welfare of the orphan children which led them to fondly call her 'Mai'.
- The Prime Minister has expressed sorrow on the demise of **Mr Neil Nongkynrih**, mentor and conductor of Shillong Chamber Choir.
- As part of the Azadi Ka Amrut Mahotsav (AKAM) celebrations across the country, the Smart Cities Mission, MoHUA has launched "Smart cities and Academia Towards Action & Research (SAAR)" program, a joint initiative of MoHUA, National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA) and leading Indian academic institutions of the country. Under the program, 15 premier architecture & planning institutes of the country will be working with Smart Cities to document landmark projects undertaken by the Smart Cities Mission
- Indira Gandhi Rashtriya Uran Akademi(IGRUA) was established by the Government of Indiain the year 1986 at Fursatganj Airfield, presently in the district of Amethi in Uttar Pradesh. IGRUA is an Autonomous Body established under the Societies Registration Act 1860 and is administered by a Governing Council under the Ex-officio Chairmanship of Secretary, Ministry of Civil Aviation. Indira Gandhi Rashtriya Uran Akademi (IGRUA)sets a new record of 19000 flying hours in 2021



- **Election Commission** announced a hike in **expenditure limit** for candidates to Rs 95 lakh (up from Rs 70 lakh) for Lok Sabha elections, and Rs 40 lakh (up from Rs 28 lakh) for Assembly polls.

- In a conservation effort to monitor seasonal fluctuations in birds' movements, the ringing
 of oriental darters has been taken up in the Keoladeo National Park after a gap of 22
 years. They are Water birds of tropical South Asia with long and slender neck which looks
 like a snake when it swims and dives into water to catch a fish.
- The **Sanjay Lake in east Delhi** has become polluted over the years and the number of birds sighted there has fallen. It is a artificial lake in Delhi
- Cabinet approves Intra-State Transmission System Green Energy Corridor Phase-II. It
 facilitates grid integration and power evacuation of about 20 GW of renewable energy
 (RE) projects in seven states -- Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Rajasthan,
 Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh.
- North Korea has successfully tested a hypersonic missile in the first major weapons test
 by the nuclear-armed nation this year. HYPERSONIC WEAPONS are those with speed
 faster than five times that of sound i.e. greater than 5 Mach
- Union Minister of State for Science & Technology inaugurated India's first open rock museum displaying different types of rocks gathered from different States of ages ranging from 3.3 billion years to around 55 million years on the campus of the CSIR-National Geophysical Research Institute (NGRI). It is located in Hyderabad
- Veer Gatha is one such unique project that has been launched to inspire the school children of our country with the stories of war heroes, brave hearts, and it has elicited a tremendous response from all over the country. For the first time as part of Republic Day celebrations, the Ministry of Defence has envisioned that school students may be motivated to do projects/activities based on gallantry award winners. - Election commission of India issued guidelines regarding attention of all media to the Section 126 of the Representation of the People Act, 1951 that prohibits displaying any election matter by means, inter alia, of television or similar apparatus, during the period of 48 hours before the hour fixed for conclusion of poll in a constituency
- 58th Foundation Day of the Food Corporation of India celebrated recently. It is Statutory body under the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, Set up in 1965 following the enactment of the Food Corporation Act, 1964
- PM extends best wishes to Indian Army personnel on Army Day
- PM pays tributes to the great Thiruvalluvar on **Thiruvalluvar Day**. He is Tamil poet, best known as the author of Thirukkural.
- Veteran journalist Sam Rajappa, a long-serving correspondent of the Kolkata-based newspaper Statesman, is no more.
- Kathak maestro Pandit Birju Maharaj passes away
- Noted environmentalist M K Prasad passes away at 89. Prasad was a guiding force behind
 the national movement against the state government's move to set up a hydro-power
 project in Silent Valley in Palakkad district in the 1970s.
- Padma Shri awardee and social activist Shanti Devi of Odisha passes away
- Indian Navy's indigenously designed and built guided missile destroyer, INS Kochi, exercised with Russian Federation Navy's RFS Admiral Tributs on 14 January 2022 in the Arabian Sea. The exercise showcased cohesiveness and interoperability between the two navies and included tactical manoeuvres, cross-deck helicopter operations and seamanship activities. It is named **Passex**. A passing exercise (a PASSEX in U.S. Navy terminology) is an exercise done between two navies to ensure that the navies are able to communicate and cooperate in times of war or humanitarian relief. Common drills include flashing light drills, semaphore drills, and flaghoist drills.
- Prime Minister has paid tributes to Bharat Ratna MGR on his birth anniversary. He was a famous actor and former chief minister of Tamilnadu
- National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) has recommended that the Delhi government must suspend its flagship 'Desh ke Mentor' programme

- Hyderabad officially bid as a candidate to host the Formula E World championship exclusively for electric cars, scheduled to be held between November 2022 and February 2023.
- India's Lakshya Sen secured his maiden Super 500 title by winning "Yonex-Sunrise India Open"
- Narendra Kumar Goenka, took charge of Apparel Export Promotion Council (AEPC) as its new Chairman.
- The Union government is planning to acquire for itself overriding powers to transfer IAS and IPS officers through Central deputation, doing away with the requirement of taking the approval of the State governments. It is as per INDIAN ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICE (CADRE) RULES 1954
- Union Labour and Employment Minister said special camps would be organised to register
 brick kiln, plantation, forestry and other unorganised sector workers on the Centre's eShram portal. It is a National Database of Unorganized Workers (NDUW) by Ministry of
 Labour and Employment
- Cabinet approves extension of tenure of the **National Commission for Safai Karamcharis** for three years. It was established in 1993.
- Large chunks of forests and the Aravalis in Gurugram and Faridabad could lose protection from construction under the National Conservation Zone as defined in the Regional Plan-2021, if the provisions in the Draft Regional Plan-2041 are implemented, fear environmentalists
- The population of the vulnerable **eastern swamp deer**, extinct elsewhere in South Asia, has dipped in the **Kaziranga National Park** and Tiger Reserve.
- Denison barb (Miss Kerala), a native freshwater fish species commonly found in parts of Karnataka and Kerala, has been included in Schedule I of the Wild Life (Protection) Amendment Bill, 2021.
- PM greets NDRF team on their Raising Day. It is specialized response team to natural and man-made disasters set up in 2005
- Sixty Ninth Meeting of Governing Body of National Water Development Agency (NWDA)
 was held recently. It is a Agency of the Union Ministry of Water Resources, set up in July,



1982 established to carry out the water balance and other studies on a scientific and realistic basis for optimum utilisation of Water Resources of the Peninsular rivers system.

- In a bid to revive the **Saraswati river**, the governments of Haryana and Himachal Pradesh will enter into an agreement that entails the building of a dam to supply round-the-year water flow to the river channel
- PM condoles demise of noted cartoonist Shri Narayan Debnath Ji
- The Supreme Court upheld the constitutional validity of reservation for Other Backward Classes (OBC) candidates in the All India Quota seats for the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) for undergraduate and postgraduate medical and dental courses, noting that "reservation is not at odds with merit" in open competitive examinations.
- Chairman of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Home Affairs has written to Home Minister and urged the government to consider "legislative action", including amendments to the IPC and CrPC, to deal with all manifestations of hate speech.
- On the Statehood Day of Manipur, Meghalaya and Tripura (21st January), Prime Minister and other leaders praised the traditions and culture of the three northeast states.
- ISRO successfully conducted a 25-second qualification test for its liquid propellant-based Vikas engine to be used under the Gaganyaan mission.
- The supersonic cruise missile BrahMos with increased indigenous content and improved performance was successfully flight-tested from the Integrated Test Range, Chandipur off the coast of Odisha
- The State of Himachal Pradesh is well on track to achieve the target of providing clean tap water supply to every rural home by 2024 under Har Ghar Jal initiative. Har Ghar Jal is a component of Jal Jeevan Mission which envisages supply of 55 litres of water per person per day to every rural household through Functional Household Tap Connections (FHTC) by 2024.
- Modalities to deepen cooperation in "Deep Ocean Mission" was recently discussed. It is India's first manned ocean mission
- The government has put out the eternal flame of the **Amar Jawan Jyoti** underneath India Gate and merged it with the one instituted at the **National War Memorial** in 2019
- The Supreme Court recently ruled that the property of a man who had died without executing a will and is survived only by a daughter will devolve upon the daughter and not others such as his brother.
- Kerala govt decides to bring Ordinance to clip Lokayukta powers. **LOKAYUKTA** is anticorruption authority or ombudsman — an official appointed by the government to represent the interests of the public.
