- 13th Bengaluru International Film Festival 2022 (BIFFES 2022) held
- Karnataka High Court highlighted only authorities notified by the State Government can
 initiate criminal prosecution for violation of provisions of the Pre-natal Diagnostic
 Techniques (Regulation and Prevention of Misuse) Act. The act prevents the misuse of
 prenatal diagnostic technique for sex selective abortion
- Maintenance amount awarded in favour of wife under the provisions of the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005, cannot be enhanced by a magistrate court by invoking the provision of the Code of Criminal Procedure (Cr.PC), which allows altering allowances awarded for maintenance of wife or children or parents of a person, said the High Court of Karnataka.

- The Food and Civil Supplies Department will start the distribution of fortified rice from April 1 in 14 districts of the state under 'Poushtika Karnataka' (Nutrition Karnataka) programme to eradicate malnutrition

- Karnataka government has launched **Women@Work (W@W) programme**. It aims to provide 5,000 jobs for women with the necessary employable skills by 2026.
- The Higher Education Department of Karnataka has signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with the British Council to provide global skills for students pursuing higher education in the state.
- Karnataka's maternal mortality ratio (MMR) has declined by nine points from 92 per lakh live births in 2016-2018 to 83 in 2017-2019, during the pre-COVID-19 period.
- 'Grameena Habba,' a platform for rural artisans to sell handicraft, agricultural, and handloom products, is being held by NABARD's Karnataka regional office in Bengaluru
- University of Mysore will be conferring a honorary doctorate on late actor Puneeth
 Rajkumar at its 102nd annual convocation
- The four-day All-India Vice-Chancellors' Conference will be held in Mysuru. University of Mysore is hosting the conference where the V-Cs of universities from across the country will participate with some on the virtual platform.
- Karnataka Chief Minister announced in his budget that the tur dal grown in Kalaburagi

 tur dal grown in Kalaburagi district only and not for all the pulses
- The State Government has decided to have year-long celebration of Shantaveri Gopala Gowda's birth centenary and also present "The Best Farmer" and "Best Legislator" awards annually in his name. He is considered one of India's most important socialist leaders, and a pioneer of socialism in Karnataka
- An Artificial Intelligence and Robotics Technology Park (ARTPARK) was launched at the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) in Bengaluru. ARTPARK has been set up to effectively use technology, specifically AI and robotics, for the country's betterment

- A report of the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India revealed that the BBMP roads in Bengaluru are more hazardous for users, with an average of 19-20 hazards per km, than the State and national highways.
- Country's first Digital Water Bank 'AQVERIUM' launched in Bengaluru aims to provide clean drinking water & sanitation

- Reserve Bank of India (RBI) allowed **Microfinance Institutions(MFI)** the freedom to set interest rates they charge borrowers. Microfinance Institution is an Organization that offers financial services to low income populations.
- The government has notified certain amendments to Census rules to allow online selfenumeration in the upcoming Census and National Population Register (NPR)

- ISRO successfully completed the ground test of the solid-fuel based booster stage (SS1) of its new Small Satellite Launch Vehicle (SSLV), completing the ground testing of all three stages of the launch vehicle
- While hearing a criminal appeal against the Bihar Government recently, Chief Justice of India admonished a counsel for submitting a 'sealed cover report' to the court. It is Practice used by the Supreme Court and sometimes lower courts, of asking for or accepting information from government agencies in sealed envelopes that can only be accessed by judges
- The Supreme Court upheld the Centre's one rank, one pension (OROP) scheme for the armed forces. It implies uniform pension to personal based on rank and length of service, irrespective of the date of retirement.
- Maharashtra has decided to withdraw from the **Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bhima Yojana** (PMFBY) if changes to it are not carried out.It is crop insurance scheme
- World's most advanced technology-developed Green Hydrogen Fuel Cell Electric Vehicle Toyota Mirai was recently launched.
- The Kerala High Court asked organisations associated with the film industry to take steps to constitute a joint committee to deal with cases of sexual harassment of women, in line with the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act of 2013
- Parliament's Standing Committee on Rural Development and Panchayati Raj has asked the government to roll back the system of caste-based wages, under which NREGS workers are paid based on whether they belong to a Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, or Others
- **Arabian Tropicbird**, one of the rarest seabirds in Kerala, has been sighted off the Kollam coast during a pelagic survey
- Government of India released India's Arctic Policy, with the aim of enhancing the country's cooperation with the resource-rich and rapidly transforming region
- Telangana has started documenting crop diversification trends in the form of an index-CROP DIVERSIFICATION INDEX for the first time in the country, following the paddy procurement row with the Centre and the state government asking farmers to opt for alternate crops.
- Information & Broadcasting Ministry asked the **Broadcast Audience Research Council** (BARC India) to resume "news channel ratings" with immediate effect.
- This year's first cyclone is set to develop in the Bay of Bengal around March 21, said the India Meteorological Department. Once it intensifies into a storm, the cyclone will be called **Asani**, a name given by Sri Lanka.
