# **STATE NEWS IN SHORT**

- President Droupadi Murmu presented the Rajat Kamal Award for the documentary film 'Naadada Navaneeta Pandit Dr. Venatesh Kumar', produced by the Department of Information and Public Relations and directed by Girish Kasaravalli. The film has been adjudged the best art and culture film in the non-feature film category at the 68th National Film Awards for 2020. The award consists of a cash component of ₹50,000 each for the producer and the director.
- Taking forward the 'Beyond Bengaluru' concept, a two-day event Techcelera-tion-2022' initiated and coordinated by Karnataka Digital Economy Mission (KDEM) will be held in Hubballi to dis-play the progress achieved so far and deliberate upon the way forward. 'Techcelera-tion-2022' would bring together the entire ecosystem of industry leaders, start-ups and businesses to showcase the growth so far, the opportunities available and the road map ahead.
- The **Bangalore city** managed to secure the **43rd national rank** by scoring 2,892.98 out of 7500. Bengaluru was one among the 45 cities with a population of above 10 lakh that was surveyed for ranking.
- The Karnataka Protection of Right to Freedom of Religion of Religion Bill, 2022, has received the assent of Governor Thaawarchand Gehlot. The Bill was passed a few days ago by the Karnataka State legislature. Now, the legislation provides for the protection of the right to freedom of religion and prohibition of unlawful conversion from one religion to another by misrepresentation, force, undue influence, coercion, allurement or by any fraudulent means.
- From a mere 124 verified healthcare professionals in its Health Professionals Registry (HPR) under Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission (ABDM) in July, Karnataka now stands first in the country with 25,511 professionals registered in its HPR.
- Kodagu district has won the first prize for its tableau at the Dasara procession in Mysuru.
- Tipu Express is renamed as Wodeyar Express.it plies between Mysuru and Bengaluru. Mysuru to Talaguppa express has been named after poet laureate Kuvempu.
- Kisan Swaraj Sammelan to be held in Mysuru. The city will host the 5 th Kisan Swaraj Sammelan of Alliance for Sustainable and Holistic Agriculture (ASHA) from November 11 to 13 in collaboration with the Karnataka State Open University (KSOU).
- The Tele Mental Health Assistance and Networking Across States (Tele-MANAS)
  initiative, which is based on Karnataka's initiative of the same name, was launched during
  the 26th Convocation of National Institute of Mental Health And Neuro Sciences
  (NIMHANS) by Mansukh Mandaviya, Union Minister for Health & Family Welfare and
  Chemicals & Fertilizers.
- Eight Karnataka-based registered unrecognised political parties (RUPPs) have been
  delisted while eight others have been notified as "inactive" by the Election Commission
  of India. The ECI can mark political parties as "inactive" in the register of RUPPs
  maintained by the Commission under Section 29A of Representation of People Act, 1951.


- A comprehensive report titled '21 st Century Skills in India; State of the Sector Report 2022" brought out by Mysuru-headquartered Grassroots Research and Advocacy Movement (GRAAM) under UNICEF's YuWaah project was released in New Delhi.
- Incidence of breast cancer in Bengaluru, which was the third highest in the country after Hyderabad and Chennai till last year, jumped to the second highest at 40.5 per lakh (ageadjusted rate AAR) this year. The highest incidence is in **Chennai at 42.2 per lakh**.
- The registration for the relaunched Yeshasvini health scheme in the State will commence from November 1. The scheme is set to become operational from January 1, 2023, and will cover 1,650 diseases. The cashless medical scheme for members of cooperative societies is up to ₹5 lakh per family per annum. There is no cap on age for becoming a beneficiary.
- International Skill Development Corporation (ISDC) headquartered in United Kingdom, has organised "Karnataka Education Innovation Conference" (KEIC 2022) in association with the State Higher Education Council.
- The state government has decided to temporarily relax the rules that any child entering class 1<sup>st</sup> should have completed six years
- Karnataka Skill Development Corporation (KSDC) and non-profit organisation
   Quest Alliance have announced an initiative aimed at providing employability skills
   to youth in Karnataka. Over 6,000 youth in 140 skills centres will benefit from the
   pilot phase of the initiative, which is rolled out in seven districts of Kalyana
   Karnataka region Kalaburagi, Raichur, Yadgir, Koppal, Ballari, Bidar, and
   Vijayanagara
- Land Grabbing Prohibition Bill: The Karnataka Land Grabbing Prohibition (Amendment) Bill, 2022, which was passed in the Legislative Assembly in September, 2022, to avoid criminal proceedings against farmers who have encroached the government land in rural areas, received assent of Governor Thaawarchand Gehlot. The Act excludes all the places from the purview of the Karnataka Land Grabbing Prohibition Act except within the limits of the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike and the City Corporations.
- An Emirates Airbus A380 aircraft will land at Kempegowda International Airport
  (KIA) for the first time in Bengaluru. A380 is the largest passenger aircraft in the
  world. The landing would also mark the commencement of operations of
  scheduled passenger services between Dubai and Bengaluru utilising the A380.
  Bengaluru will become the second Indian city to be served by the airline's A380
  aircraft, after Mumbai.
- Dr Veerendra Heggade, Rajya Sabha member and Dharmadhikari of Dharmasthala temple, to inaugurate Maha Kumbh Mela at Triveni Sangama
- Mysuru's solid waste handling goes green as electric vehicles (e-rickshaws) are now carrying garbage collected from households.
- The country's 5<sup>th</sup> Vande Bharath Express will ply on the Mysuru –Bengaluru-Chennai
- Bharat Petroluem Corporation would set up two fast charging EV corriodor,
   Bangalore mysore –Coorg and Bengaluru Chennai

 Karnataka's beloved 'water sage' Kalmane Kamegowda passed away. In Karnataka, he was revered as the "pond man" for being the person behind more than 15 man-made ponds. He even received accolades from Prime Minister

- International millet mela would be organised in Bengaluru for three days from January 2023, following the declaration of International Year of Millets by the United Nations.
- The indigenous medium altitude long endurance (MALE) unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) developed by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and production partner HAL
- The Karnataka Digital Economy Mission (KDEM), an initiative of Government of Karnataka, has organised a two-day second edition of the Big Tech Show-2022 at Mysore
- Karnataka Vikas Grameena Bank (KVGB), a Regional Rural Bank, signed an MoU (Memorandum of Understanding) with Piaggio Vehicles for extending financial

- **assistance for vehicles** run on diesel, CNG and electricity under the bank's Small Road Transport Operators (SRTO) Scheme
- K C General Hospital has received the Centre's Labour Room Quality Improvement Initiative (LaQshya) certification with a 98% score. It is a programme, under the National Quality Assurance Standards (NQAS), aims to improve the quality of care in labour rooms and maternity operation theatres.

- Defence public sector undertaking BEML Ltd has bagged the 'Raksha Mantri's Award for Excellence' under the group award category for design and development of 180 tonne class electric hydraulic excavator
- The Horticulture Department will soon set up its own nurseries in **Lalbagh Botanical Garden and Cubbon Park.** The nursery in Cubbon Park is already propagating a few varieties and will soon open its door to the public to buy saplings from.
- **K. Naganna Gowda** as the new chairperson of Karnataka State Commission for Child Rights (KSCPCR) for a term of three years.
- Jamkhandi in Bagalkot district, will get a 'flex fuel' station that will be India's first. Flex fuel, or flexible fuel, is an alternative fuel in which gasoline is combined with methanol or ethanol.
- The Karnataka Digital Economy Mission (KDEM) and the Vidyavardhaka College
  of Engineering (VVCE) have signed an MoU to establish a centre of excellence and
  train students at the VVCE campus in Mysuru.

- The JSS Academy of Higher Education and Research has been featured within the top 150 rank by Times Higher Education World University Rankings by Subject for 2023, according to a release. The JSS AHER has been ranked in the band 126-150 in the subject Clinical and Health.

- Rajyotsava award 2022 has been announced: Award-winning personalities include



- The indigenously developed Light Combat Helicopter (LCH) 'Prachand', meaning fierce was formally inducted into the Indian Air Force at the Jodhpur airbase.
- The Centre has appointed Justice Dinesh Kumar Sharma of the Delhi High Court as the presiding officer of the tribunal for the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA), related to the ban on the Popular Front of India (PFI) and its associates. Once an organisation is banned under the provisions of UAPA, a tribunal is set up by the government to adjudicate whether there are sufficient grounds for the decision.
- Around 62% of rural households in India had fully functional tap water connections
  within their premises, according to a survey commissioned by the Union Ministry of Water
  Resources to assess the functioning of the government's marquee Jal Jeevan Mission.
- The country's first 4.20-MW wind turbine generator, a single unit with the largest generation capacity, has been installed at Vadalivilai near Valliyoor in Tirunelveli district. The Brazil-based WEG, involved in a range of businesses, including power generation, mining, oil, gas and sugar industries and having its manufacturing unit at SIPCOT Industrial Estate, Hosur, has installed the state-of-the-art gearless wind turbine generator at a cost of ₹88 crore at Vadalivilai, which is close to the advantageous Aralvaimozhi Pass.
- The Government appointed former Eastern Army Commander Lt. General Anil Chauhan (Retd) as the next Chief of Defence Staff (CDS). The post has been vacant since the untimely death of the country's first CDS Gen. Bipin Rawat in a helicopter crash in December 2021.
- Senior advocate R. Venkataramani has been appointed as the new Attorney General (AG) of India by President Droupadi Murmu for a period of three year. Mr. Venkataramani will succeed K. K. Venugopal
- The Government of Odisha, in collaboration with the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI), hosted the Odisha Investors' Meet in Bengaluru.
- The World Bank has estimated that India will grow 6.5% in the current fiscal year (FY22-23), after having grown at 8.7% in the fiscal year ended March 31. The Indian economy is expected to speed up to 7.0% in the next fiscal year, before settling back down to 6.1% in FY24-25.
- India's unemployment rate drastically dropped to 6.43% in September due to an increase in labour participation in the rural and urban areas, according to data from the Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy (CMIE).
- Scientists from Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) have mapped out the global distribution of sodium on the Moon's surface. They used the CLASS instrument (Chandrayaan-2 large area soft X-ray spectrometer) carried by the second Indian Moon mission, Chandrayaan-2
- Modi inaugurated the **900-metre-long Mahakal Lok corridor** built at the Mahakaleshwar temple in Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh.
- MIDHANI Mishra Datu Nigam's cyber security portal was launched by Chairman and Managing Director S.K. Jha as part of the ongoing 'Cyber Jaagrookta Maah' till October 31 as a mass awareness campaign

- International workshop on disaster risk reduction to be held in Thiruvananthapuram
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi declared **Modhera**, a village in the Mehsana district of Gujarat as India's first solar-powered village
- The Union Cabinet approved a proposal to develop a container terminal at Tuna-Tekra, Deendayal Port, in Gujarat under the public-private partnership mode. Deendayal Port is one of the 12 major ports in India and is located on the west coast in the Gulf of Kutch in Gujarat.
- Tamil Nadu has emerged as the only State which has achieved the target for 2022 Q1 and Q2 for Jal Jeevan Mission, with 69.57 lakh households provided with tap connections till date, according to official data.
- Gujarat conducted 36<sup>th</sup> National Games across six cities of the state reiterated India's organisational skills. Services continued its dominance as it topped the medals table with 61 gold, 35 silver and 32 bronze medals to claim the prestigious Raja Bhalendra Singh Cup for the fourth consecutive time. Maharashtra was placed second and secured the top position among the States. Karnataka secured fourth place
- Swimmers Sajan Prakash and 14-year-old Hashika Ramachandra were named the best male and female athletes in national games

The new species of spiders were found from the Garo hills in Meghalaya, the Thar desert of Rajasthan, Wayanad Wildlife Sanctuary, Kottappara hills

  Bogota, Mexico City, Montreal and Fortaleza in Brazil.

Integration of BHAVISHYA portal with State Bank of India and the commencement of process to further integrate the same with all Pension Disbursing Bank portals - a milestone development which shall enable Pensioners to get all information and services at one place with single login
- A pilot project in the Eastern Himalayas is set to usher in smarter facilities for raising the living standards of troops posted along the border with China in the Tawang sector of western Arunachal Pradesh

- Two more Indian beaches Minicoy Thundi beach and Kadmat beach, both in Lakshadweep have been accorded the coveted International eco-label 'Blue Flag', taking India's tally to 12 in the list of the world's cleanest and most eco-friendly "beaches, marinas, and sustainable boating tourism operators
- Mangarh Dham is known for the massacre of tribals by the british Indian Army in 1913. It is considered a pilgrimage site for Bhil tribals situated near the Rajasthan Gujarat border
- The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is working on a series of improvements to the NavIC, or India's equivalent of the Global Positioning System (GPS), so that more people are motivated to install it and use it. Plans are also afoot to make its reach global rather than circumscribe it to India and a limited territory
- Ayush Utsav was inaugurated at the Ganderbal, Kashmir
- Indian Air Force (IAF) and French Air and Space Force (FASF) are participating in a bilateral exercise, named 'Garuda VII', at Air Force Station Jodhpur.

• Nobel Peace Prize 2022: The 2022 Nobel Peace Prize has been jointly awarded to Belarusian human rights advocate Ales Bialiatski, the Russian human rights

organisation Memorial, and the Ukrainian human rights organisation Centre for Civil Liberties. The award was announced by the Norwegian Nobel Committee in Oslo

- The Nobel Prize for Physiology this year has been awarded to Svante Pääbo, Swedish geneticist, who pioneered the field of palaeogenomics, or the study of ancient hominins by extracting their DNA.
- Nobel Prize in physics: Alain Aspect from the University of Paris-Saclay, France;
  John F. Clauser of John F. Clauser and Associates, California, U.S.; and Anton
  Zeilinger, University of Vienna, Austria. They have been awarded "for experiments
  with entangled photons, establishing the violation of Bell inequalities and
  pioneering quantum information science"
- Nobel prize in chemistry: A trio of chemists, Carolyn Bertozzi, Morten Meldal and Barry Sharpless, are this year's Nobel laureates for Chemistry. They won it for pioneering 'click chemistry', which underpins green chemistry.
- Economic Sciences Nobel: The Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences has decided to award the 2022 Sveriges Riksbank Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel to Ben S. Bernanke, Douglas W. Diamond and Philip H. Dybvig "for research on banks and financial crises." The 2022 economic sciences laureates Douglas Diamond and Philip Dybvig developed theoretical models that explain why banks exist, how their role in society makes them vulnerable to rumours about their impending collapse and how society can lessen this vulnerability.
