- Karnataka would set up the country's first green hydrogen cluster in Mangaluru
- The Archives at the National Centre for Biological Sciences (NCBS) in Bengaluru announced the launch of a **new collection of archival material**, related to the entomologist and plant pathologist Leslie Charles Coleman, who worked in the princely state of Mysore in the early 20th century. The collection documents the work of Coleman, a Canadian who was the first Director of Agriculture in Mysore State in pre-independent India between 1913 and 1934.
- The two day International Conference on Spacecraft Mission Operations (SMOPS-2023) concluded in Bengaluru. It was organized by ISRO, Italian Space Agency (ASI) and the International Academy of Astronautics (IAA)
- Rao Bahadur H.C. Javaraya, he was the first Indian superintendent of Lalbagh Botanical Gardens, and the brains behind the fruit research station in Hesaraghatta which later became the Indian Institute of Horticultural Research.

- The Karnataka State Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA Karnataka) has slapped a fine of Rs 1.6 crore on Wistron, one of three Taiwanese iPhone manufacturers in India, for not complying with the environment clearance (EC) mandates for capacity expansion 2021.
- The U.S. will open two new consulates in Bengaluru and Ahmedabad while India will establish a mission in Seattle to boost people-to-people relationships.
- To discuss and address critical issues related to youth empowerment, NIMHANS, in association with the Union Ministry of Youth Affairs, will host a two-day 'Y20 Consultation'. Focusing on the crucial theme of 'Health, Well-being, and Sports: Agenda for Youth', the consultation is aimed at creating an inclusive and collaborative space for individuals from diverse backgrounds, including educators, healthcare professionals and policy-makers
- Karnataka Forest, Ecology and Environment department will plant 1 crore sapling and will be geo-tagged to ensure long-term maintenance and audit.
- Two geospatial organisations, **Allterra and NeoGeo** have collaboratively won the largest-ever drone-based land parcel mapping contract through an open tender process from the Karnataka government.

- National Cybersecurity Coordinator, outlined a draft of called as "Delhi Declaration", a series of commitments to "responsible state behaviour in cyberspace" for G-20 member countries, drawn from existing non-binding norms that they have already signed onto under the auspices of the United Nations.
- President Droupadi Murmu has been conferred with Suriname's highest civilian award by President Chandrikapersad Santokhi to honour the deep-rooted bilateral ties.
- Maiden International Cruise Vessel MV Empress, India's first international cruise vessel - from Chennai to Sri Lanka in Chennai was flagged
- Myanmar's Power Sector Professionals get training from NTPC in Microgrids and Electric Vehicles Technologies, under Government's Capacity Building Programme
- Nyaya Vikas Portal created for monitoring the implementation of Centrally Sponsored Schemes
- Indian Council of Agricultural Research signs a MOU with Amazon Kisan to Empower Farmers
- IICA and NALSAR launch "LL.M in Insolvency and Bankruptcy Laws" programme

- GSI proposes 'Geo Heritage' tag for Jurassic age 'Natural Arch' in Odisha. Apart from the arch at Sundargarh, India has two others- one at Tirumala hills in Tirupati and another at Andaman and Nicobar

- The Kerala government is all set to promote the State's monsoon tourism across West Asia to tap the highly promising market ahead of the summer vacation in the Gulf region.
- All panchayats across the country will mandatorily use digital payments for development work and revenue collection from this Independence Day and they will be declared UPI-enabled

- Drones will be deployed at 100 hotspots in and around Bengaluru to identify the
  relative share of different sources of pollution in the project launched by National
  Institute of Advanced Studies (NIAS) along with the Environment Management

  when drones will be used to develop the emission inventory.

### **International Issues**

- Iran is set to reopen its embassy in Saudi Arabia following a seven-year closure.
- Mazagon Dock and German firm strike deal on submarines. They will now jointly bid for the Navy's Project-75I to build six advanced submarines in India
- Germany is preparing to host the biggest air deployment exercise in NATO's history, a show of force intended to impress allies and potential adversaries
- Iran claimed that it had created a hypersonic missile capable of travelling at 15 times the speed of sound, adding a new weapon to its arsenal as tensions remain high with the United States over its nuclear programme. The new missile called 'Fattah,' or 'Conqueror' in Farsi
- The United States and Britain announced a new strategic pact called "Atlantic Declaration", as their leaders rededicated the "special relationship" to counter Russia, China and economic instability. This declaration adopted by the leaders aims to boost industry ties on defense and renewable energy, in the face of growing competition from China.
- NATO concluded its largest ever air force deployment exercise in Europe in a show of force against potential threats such as Russia
- Pakistan began transporting discounted Russian crude oil to a refinery in the cashstrapped country, it is likely to provide relief to the people hit by inflation.
- The UN cultural and scientific agency UNESCO announced that the U.S. plans to rejoin — and pay more than \$600 million in back dues — after a decade-long dispute sparked by the organisation's move to include Palestine as a member
- Honduras opened an embassy in Beijing, the Central American nation broke off relations with Taiwan to establish diplomatic ties with China.
- India and the UAE set a target to increase the non-oil trade from the current \$48 billion to \$100 billion by 2030.
- The European Parliament has approved the bloc's landmark rules for artificial intelligence, known as the EU AI Act, clearing a major hurdle for the first formal regulation of AI in the West to become law.
- UN General Assembly adopts Resolution to establish a new Memorial Wall for fallen Peacekeepers, piloted by India
- The Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC) summit at end of 2023 will adopt Bangkok Vision 2030. This would be an overarching kind of document and would give direction to the organisation towards sustainable development.
- The dispute settlement body of the World Trade Organisation (WTO) on agreed not to adopt a ruling against India's import duties on certain information and technology products, following a request by the country and the European Union (EU). Both regions have requested this as they are engaged in resolving the dispute bilaterally. The dispute panel of the WTO had ruled that the import duties imposed by India on certain information and technology products violate global trading



- norms. The EU and India have said that the additional time would help facilitate the resolution of the dispute.
- The United States military can develop and operate out of bases in Papua New Guinea, according to a landmark security pact underpinning Washington's efforts to outflank China in the Pacific.
- Japan's age of consent was raised from 13, among the world's lowest, to 16 years old as lawmakers passed key reforms to sex crime legislation.
- Daniel Ellsberg, the U.S. military analyst whose change of heart on the Vietnam War led him to leak the classified "Pentagon Papers," revealing U.S. government deception about the war and setting off a major freedom-of-the-press battle, died
- Researchers Discover 20 New Species of Sea Lettuce in the Baltic Sea Region
- An attack on a school on the Uganda-Congo border by suspected Islamist militants is yet another cruel reminder of the worsening security situation in Africa
- Europe should brace for more deadly heatwaves driven by climate change, noting the world's fastest-warming continent was some 2.3 degree Celcius hotter last year than in pre-industrial times.
- China signed an agreement worth \$4.8 billion with cash-strapped Pakistan to set up a 1,200-MW nuclear power plant at **Chashma in Mianwali** district of Punjab.
- Qatar announced a second 27-year supply deal with a Chinese company as it expands production from the world's biggest natural gas field.
